Register Now for National Jamboree 2010

July 19, 2010 through August 3, 2010

Join the Chief Seattle Council and 35,000 Scouts and Scouters in celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America at the 2010 National Jamboree. Our council contingent will consist of 5 troops of 36 boys each. This jamboree will most likely be the highlight of a Scouting career for those scouts and adults who attend

Scouts can join one of our 5 contingent troops that will travel together and represent our council at the jamboree.

Adult Scouters can volunteer to work as a staff member at the jamboree. There are over 7500 volunteer staff positions available.

The Chief Seattle Council Jamboree Committee has been busily working to prepare for this event for our five troops. The committee is charged with organizing and coordinating our local troops.

While we will be glad to try and answer questions regarding national staff, those positions will be filled and managed by the national council. Online registration is available for these positions and can be accessed online at www.MyScouting.org.

Below you will find jamboree information to help you get started. We have 180 youth and 20 unit leader positions in our five troops. These troops may fill up very quickly so do not delay in submitting your application.

Trip Details

When – July 19, 2010 through August 3, 2010

Where – Jamboree will be held at Fort AP Hill, Virginia

Scout Attendance Qualifications –

- Must be approved by his Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout coach and the local council jamboree committee
- Must be at least 12 years old or have completed the sixth grade by July 1, 2010
- Must be a First Class Scout by July 1, 2010
- 18th birthday must not be before August 3, 2010
- Must participate in the pre-jamboree training experience
- Must complete a class 3 personal health and medical record, including a physical exam, before training event
- Scout must be active in his home troop for at least six months prior to July 1, 2010

Cost –

\$3500 per scout (estimated) – includes round trip airfare, jamboree fee, pre-jamboree tour, meals, lodging, unit and patrol equipment, insurance, and pre-jamboree training. There will be several opportunities for fund raising activities. Details are being worked out for easy payment plans. First \$100 is due upon receipt of your completed application, and next installment of \$1000 will be due in January 2009.

“I’m to Ready Go” – How do I Sign Up?

Parents may register their scout online at www.MyScouting.org. There is also a link from on www.scouting.org/jamboree. Go to the Web site and create a login user ID and password. You must have your BSA member ID number to create a user account. This is on your membership card. You may also call the council office for your number.

There will be a window on the login screen informing the user of the BSA member ID number requirement. Create a user account. Now you can create an online application.

When submitting, the applicant will be asked to pay a \$10 processing fee payable by credit/debt card only. ***The \$10 processing fee is nonrefundable.***

All youth and leader applications will be instructed to print their confirmation, have it signed by their Scoutmaster, and mail or take the signed document and a \$100 deposit to their local council office. ***\$100 deposit will be refundable if not selected to attend.***

Note: This confirmation does not guarantee a spot in a council jamboree troop. Council jamboree leadership will conduct interviews with each Scout as part of the selection process.
