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Registration and Cost

Registration fees are non-refundable

\$25.00 Per Person

Registration deadline is April 12th, 2019. You may pre-register online at the link below. If you fail to pre-register, we cannot guarantee an adequate number of patches. The cost per person will also increase to cover additional unforeseen costs. Proof of registration is required to Check into campsites and receive patches and awards. **Walk-ins are accepted!**

MEDICAL FORMS ARE REQUIRED AT CHECK-IN. TROOPS WITHOUT WILL BE NOT ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE.

Check-In and Campsite Set-Up

Upon request of camp rangers , vehicles are not allowed at the campsites. All vehicles except identified staff vehicles must park in the designated parking area. This is to leave room for emergency and ranger vehicles.

Troops should be prepared to hike in gear to campsite from parking lot. Wheel Barrels may be available for use. Troops will be assigned their designated campsite upon arrival.

Unit Check in will begin at 5:00 pm on Friday April 27th.and will close at 10:00 pm. Troops who will be arriving later than 10:00pm may take longer to check in and may have difficulty finding a campsite. If your troop intends on arriving Saturday morning we ask you inform us ahead of time and to arrive before 9:00am will have to

Bring the following (Completed copies of all forms attached to this Guide):

- **Unit Registration Form:**(Refer to end of this packet). Crucial for Camp Evacuation Procedures.
- **Medical Forms A&B** (C is only required for Campouts lasting longer than 72 hours)
- **Patrol Competition Registration Forms:** This is Crucial to scoring.

MEDICAL FORMS ARE REQUIRED!

We are not allowed to check in troops unless they have their medical forms present at check-in.

As your Scout master and Senior patrol leader checks in at the camporee office, your unit will be shown to your campsite. Remember, all equipment must be hiked in—no private vehicles allowed past the parking lot. Your cooperation in not parking in restricted areas is extremely important to the safety of the Camporee. Parking in campsites is not permitted, unless special permission is obtained for valid reasons (e.g. a handicapped person needing close access to a vehicle.)

Check-out and Campsite Clean-up

Checkout hours are Saturday after the closing campfire, and Sunday 7AM until 11AM. All Troops should use the following checklist to clean campsites. All troops will be expected to have their campsite inspected upon checkout.

LEAVE YOUR CAMPSITE CLEANER THAN YOU FOUND IT TROOPS WILL BE HELD AS LONG AS NEEDED TO ENSURE CAMPSITES ARE CLEAN!

- Adirondacks Swept out and all trash removed. (including under bunks)
- Troop Bathrooms Swept and Cleaned
- All Campsite Trashcans liners removed and replaced. (including bathroom trashcans)
- Campsite swept for trash and fire bowl extinguished

Be Prepared

- SCOUTBOOK (Make sure you have at least one copy per patrol)
- The Ten Essentials (look in scout book)
- Daypack
- Class A uniform (Flag Ceremonies)
- Class B uniform (All Field Activities)
- Extra Footwear
- Personal Eating Utensils, etc.
- Tent (Just in case)
- Sleeping Bag & Sleeping Pad
- Toiletries – toothbrush, soap...
- Personal Medication (if any)
- Backpack (optional for hiking)

Competition and Other Events

Early Morning Training Session:

Patrols will have time to practice their scout-skills and receive assistance from adults & staff without worry of being graded on performance. Staff are not permitted to sign off on requirements completed during the day.

- Graded On a per troop basis (Must be cooked in Dutch oven and by the boys)
- Submission needs a name

Skits and Campfire

- Patrols will be awarded an automatic 5 Points if they perform a skit during campfire.
- All awards will be announced during Campfire.

Shooting Sports

At our Shooting Sports Safety comes first at our ranges. All range directors are certified in the use and instruction of their respective firearms. Scouts and Scouters will only shoot when our certified and trained adult supervision is present. All ages are welcome at our ranges. While at Ranges we want to remind scout that this a high safety area and all scout and scout masters are required to follow the instruction of range staff always.

Rules and Guidelines

- The Scout Law, The Scout Oath & Outdoor Code is the law of the camp.
- **No cars or trucks will be allowed past the parking lot without permission and a Vehicle Pass issued at Camporee Check-in.**

- Please report all accidents, injuries, or other emergencies to an Adult member of the Camporee staff. Medics on site will be prepared to handle these situations.
- Please turn in lost and found items at the Camporee Office. Unclaimed items will be available at the May Roundtable and the Scout Office after Camporee.
- No Scout can leave camp after check-in without a release from his parents or Scout leader. He must be accompanied by an authorized adult while out of camp and must sign out at the camp office before departing. When releasing a boy into someone else's custody, you must be sure that person has parental consent to do so.
- Scouts must stay out of other troops' campsites/cabins unless invited. Off-limit areas include maintenance areas and staff quarters.
- All fires must be tended, and follow basic fire safety guidelines.
- No vandalization of Camp Pigott property.
- All liquid fuels must be stored in the camp fuel locker. Liquid fuels must be used under adult supervision only.
- No Throwing of any objects
- No intoxicating beverages or illegal drugs (including marijuana) are allowed on any BSA property.
- **ANY VIOLATION OF THESE RULES WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE REMOVAL FROM CAMP.**

Emergency Preparedness

Be Prepared

It is extremely important to have equipment shakedowns and practices before coming to Camporee. One suggestion is to distribute the list of required equipment and have a "demo" night to make sure that all Scouts and parents understand what clothing and equipment are essential to have a good experience.

- Be prepared for a number of weather conditions
- Make Sure the adult to check in has the medical forms of all boys present at the campout.
- Make sure the unit roster at the end of this packet is completed and turned in upon arrival.
- Make Staff aware of any allergies or medical conditions your youth have. Youth with epi pens must carry them on their person at all times and make sure patrol members know how to use it

Lost Person/ Search and Rescue

- First, recount all personnel, and then identify specifically who is missing.
- Determine last known location.
- Send two runners to nearest first-aid station or to check-in office.
- Keep remaining personnel in camp until further notification.
- Let the Camporee staff coordinate search or rescue operations.
- Camporee Staff will search for a maximum of 45 minutes, and then turn over the operation to the Sheriff.

Evacuation Procedure

In case of the chance we need to evacuate the camp please refer to the following procedures.

- Make Staff Aware of situation
- Please let the Staff be the ones who contact the rangers
- Listen for Emergency bell
- Ensure staff have a list of all members in your unit present at the event and identify weather their gender and whether a Youth, Youth+, Or Adult (**Refer to Unit Roster Form**)
- Count for all personnel
- Move unit to parade field by the Camp Edward Fort
- Re-count for all personnel
- Inform Staff of any missing personnel
