### **Check-In Procedure**

We ask that units try to arrive in the Parking Lot 15 minutes prior to Check in and remain in vehicles so we have time to complete temperature checks. Once your unit has been temp checked, staff will direct you to the check in table.

We ask that all units have the following forms completed and ready to go upon arrival to Camp in order expedite the Check in Process.

- **Covid Group Health Form** (Refer to the back of this packet.)
- Medical Forms A&B (C is only required for Campouts lasting longer than 72 hours)

# **Cub Scout Participation**

Cub Scouts will be allowed to shadow units, but please realize that space is limited this year due to Covid 19 and Scouts who need Trail to First Class Rank Advancement should take priority. Adult Unit Leaders are responsible for all cub scouts they bring in attendance. The Same Registration and Check In Procedures will apply to Cub Scouts as well.

At the end of each Session, units will be directed back to their cars. We ask that Unit Leaders please stop by the Check-in Table and grab their units Medical Forms before leaving Camp. Do to the uncertainty of the Event, patches will not be arriving before the event, they will be mailed.

# **Program**

During the event scouts will participate in three 1.5 hour sessions that teach a number of scout skills pertaining to Trail to First Class.

#### Fire building

Scout Rank 5. Tell what you need to know about pocketknife safety.

Second Class 2a. Explain when it is appropriate to use a fire for cooking or other purposes and when it would not be appropriate to do so.

Second Class 2b. Use the tools listed in Tenderfoot requirement 3d to prepare tinder, kindling, and fuel wood for a cooking fire.

Second Class 2c. At an approved outdoor location and time, use the tinder, kindling, and fuel wood from Second Class requirement 2b to demonstrate how to build a fire. Unless prohibited by local fire restrictions, light the fire. After allowing the flames to burn safely for at least two minutes, safely extinguish the flames with minimal impact to the fire site.

Scouts will also have a miniature fire building competition and Order of the Arrow Staff will adjust stations to meet the needs of each groups experience and skill sets.

#### Lashings/Knots

Scout Rank 4a. Show how to tie a square knot, two half-hitches, and a taut-line hitch. Explain how each knot is used.

Scout Rank 4b. Show the proper care of a rope by learning how to whip and fuse the ends of different kinds of rope. Relay/Activity

Second Class 2f. Demonstrate tying the sheet bend knot. Describe a situation in which you would use this knot.

Second Class 2g. Demonstrate tying the bowline knot. Describe a situation in which you would use this knot.

First Class 3a. Discuss when you should and should not use lashings.

First Class 3b. Demonstrate tying the timber hitch and clove hitch.

First Class 3c. Demonstrate tying the square, shear, and diagonal lashings by joining two or more poles or staves together.

First Class 3d. Use lashings to make a useful camp gadget or structure.

Scouts will have time to work on a Tarp/Lashing Structure to help practice there knots and lashing.


