Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

The two years, from the start of Webelos until after Summer Camp with their future Scouts BSA troop, are a transitional phase full of learning, growth, teamwork, and FUN!

These two years can be broken down into these phases:

- Cub Scouts
 Webelos
 Arrow of Light
- Crossover
- Scouts BSA
 Scout
 Tenderfoot
 Second Class
 First Class





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Cub Scouts:

Webelos

Starts after earning Bear Rank

Program year opportunities for Advancement and meeting local Troops

Summer Camp (in the summer months after earning Bear Rank)

Fall camporees and troop recruitment events

Winter Camp and Klondike

Spring camporee

Ends with earning Webelos Rank





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Cub Scouts:

Arrow of Light

Starts after earning Webelos Rank

Program year opportunities for Advancement and meeting local Troops

Summer Camp (in the summer months after earning Bear Rank)

Fall camporees and troop recruitment events

Winter Camp

Ends with earning AOL Rank and Crossing Over into Scouts BSA





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Cub Scouts:

Arrow of Light

Why earn Arrow of Light rank?

Required rank work is foundational for Scouts BSA.

It's the only Cub Scout award that may be worn on the Scouts BSA uniform

There is a Square Knot patch for Scouters who earned Arrow of Light rank.





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Cub Scouts:

Crossover

Typically in the Spring

Often around the Blue & Gold Banquet, which is usually in February





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Cub Scouts:

Crossover

If the AoL Cub Scout completes the AoL required adventures, they earn the AoL rank.

If they did not finish the requirements for Arrow of Light, they may Crossover into Scouts BSA, anyway.

If the scout needs a little more time for AoL requirements, a little more time is permitted

If the scout has no desire to complete AoL, but wants to Crossover, proceed.

Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Scouts BSA:

Trail to First Class

The general consensus is an active scout can easily go from Crossover to First Class Rank within 18ish months

This is most effectively done through Experiential Learning

The requirements for Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks may be worked on simultaneously; however, these ranks must be earned in sequence. (p. 441 of the Scouts BSA Handbook)

Scouts BSA:

Trail to First Class

Scout Rank

Is nearly the same as Arrow of Light "Scouting Adventure", except for a couple of additional requirements.

The first rank you can earn in Scouts BSA is the "Scout" rank. This rank shows you, your fellow Scouts, and your leaders that you know and understand Scouting's basic premises.

Tenderfoot Rank

The second rank you can earn in Scouts BSA is the "Tenderfoot" rank. This rank starts the dive into skill work. You will begin to learn about how to be a successful, reliable, and self-reliant Scout that people can count on to know their way around the outdoors and turn to for other important life skills. In short, this is the beginning to the three ranks where you learn foundational practices that you will later build upon so you can be a strong leader.

Second Class Rank

To earn the Second Class rank, you'll expand your Scoutcraft skills, spending more nights outdoors, building a campfire, planning and cooking camp meals, the using a compass and map, identifying wild animals and plants, and developing swimming and water rescue skills. You'll also perform community service and begin learning about things like earning and saving money.

Scouts BSA:

First Class Rank

Requirement for the First Class rank include continuing to build on the Scoutcraft skills learned for the Second Class rank, plus learning about weather, the use of a GPS unit, canoeing or kayaking, more advanced first aid and rescue techniques, and civic concerns like constitutional rights and obligations.

Why is this transition phase so crucial?

 These years are often when scouts leave Scouting for good, due to:

Lack of interest
Poor relationships with peers or leaders
Increased participation competitive sports
Increased focus on musical performance

 Gain invitations to Troop events that are appropriate for Webelos/AoL Cub Scouts

Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

How do we ensure an ideal transition to Scouts BSA?

• Plan a fitting Crossover that celebrates the Cub Scout work completed and the future after Cub Scouts (Scouts BSA, sports, music, etc)

Representatives (Scouts & Leaders) from their future troops should be at Crossover to receive the new Scouts into their troop.





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

How do we ensure an ideal transition to Scouts BSA?

• Plan a fitting Crossover that celebrates the Cub Scout work completed and the future after Cub Scouts (Scouts BSA, sports, music, etc)

If a Scout is resolute that they're not continuing with Scouting after Cub Scouts, it's Kind to recognize what will be next for them:

- Members of their sports team
- Bandmates
- · Dance studio
- · Etc





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Can't Scouting fit with sports/band/etc?

Of course!

This is one of the reasons to allow scouts to vet numerous troops. They all have their own culture that includes differences in:

- · Schedule
- · How Youth led is interpreted
- · Camping culture
- · Community Service culture





Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Can't Scouting fit with sports/band/etc?

- Of course!
- Allowing Cub Scouts & their families to decide on their future troop without expectation of outcome is pinnacle!

Demonstrations about the use of Scoutbook

Explaining the Advancement process

Webelos-to-Scouts Transition

Solutions:

- Parents not ready to "let go"?
- Sometimes a new Crossover into the troop might be the oldest of their family's kids

This might be the first time a parent has had to allow increased independence for their child.

Acknowledge that it is new territory for their family
