Why Advancement?

The Objectives of Scouting

- Character development
- Citizenship training
- Leadership
- Mental and physical fitness

Every activity in Scouting should support one or more of these aims.





Methods of Scouting

- Scouting ideals
- Patrol method
- Advancement
- Association with adults
- Outdoors
- Leadership development
- Uniform
- Personal growth



Advancement is...

- ✤ A method (2.0.0.1)
 - Not an end in itself
- Based on experiential learning (2.0.0.2)
 - Designed to educate or expand horizons
- A means for personal growth (2.0.0.3)
 - Age-appropriate, surmountable hurdles that allow Scouts to learn and gain confidence



Three Steps in Cub Scout Advancement

- Preparation learning new skills in den, pack, and family activities
- Qualification adult approval of requirement completions
- Recognition accomplishments acknowledged at den and pack ceremonies where awards/badges are presented

Four Steps of Scouts BSA Advancement

- Learn a Scout learns by doing, growing, and then teaching (EDGE method)
- Test making sure the Scout has completed the requirements
- Review the Scout participates in a Board of Review (except for Scout rank)
- Recognize first by public announcement; then by presentation of badge; finally at a formal court of honor.



Role of the Pack Advancement Coordinator

- Parent education
- Promotion of advancement tools
- Recordkeeping and reporting
- Recognition

Role of the *Troop* Advancement Coordinator

- Support unit leader's vision for advancement
- Educate parents or guardians and unit leaders to stimulate advancement within the troop
- Help plan, facilitate, and conduct regularly scheduled Courts of Honor
- Obtain necessary badges and certificates
- Know and understand the advancement procedures for the program served, especially for Eagle Scout, Summit, and Quartermaster



Role of the *Troop* Advancement Coordinator (cont.)

- Assist the unit leader in establishing practices that will help each new Scout achieve First Class within 18 months of joining, and Star rank soon thereafter
- Arrange for timely boards of review (monthly is suggested) and invite Scouts who are ready for them
- Keep advancement records and submit advancement reports to the troop committee
- Use the BSA's internet portal or Scoutbook to report advancement to the local council



Role of the *Troop* Advancement Coordinator (cont.)

- Confirm Merit Badge Counselors are registered with the council
 - Scoutbook
 - Territory or district provided current list
- With youth leadership, help maintain a library of advancement literature
- Learn about and promote other Scouting awards and recognitions
- ✤ Guide to Advancement 3.0.0.3 Unit Advancement Responsibilities



Advancement Reporting

- Units must report all advancement to the local council via Internet Advancement or Scoutbook
- ✤ scoutbook.<u>scouting</u>.org
- Scouts BSA Advancement should be reported at least monthly to ensure current and accurate records
- All advancement for a calendar year must be recorded during that year to count for Journey to Excellence



A Unit Advancement Coordinator should...

- Be familiar with the rank requirements for their unit's program
- Maintain the unit's advancement records and report advancement to the Council using Internet Advancement or Scoutbook
- Help scouts and parents understand the rank and badge requirements
- Act as an advisor to parents (in Cub Scouts) and scouts (in Scouts BSA) and to encourage advancement



In Summary, Advancement...

- Encourages Scouts to learn new skills and explore new subject areas
- Provides a tangible reward for hard work
- Helps build confidence
- Facilitates a Scout's personal growth
- Provides a method to fulfill the mission and objectives of Scouting







Scoutbook for managing advancement

Scoutbook is the BSA's online unit management tool and helps Scouts, parents and leaders track advancement and milestone achievements along the Scouting trail

Some Advantages to Scoutbook:

- Up to the minute visibility of your Scout's official BSA advancement record. You can view whenever you want.
- Make adjustments as necessary without contacting council
- Automatically keeps the unit in compliance with BSA advancement reporting requirements
- If a Scout moves, their advancement record follows them
- As of January 1, 2019, Scoutbook subscriptions are free to all scouting units
- Full unit management system
