



Wool cap one year

Cigarette butt two to five years

Disposable diaper: 10 to 20 years

Hard plastic container: 20 to 30 years

Rubber boot sole: 50 to 80 years

Tin can 80 to 100 years

Aluminum can 200 to 400 years

Plastic six-pack holder: 450 years








Land Ethic

"A thing is right when it tends to preserve the integrity, stability, and beauty of the biotic community. It is wrong when it tends otherwise."

"The land ethic simply enlarges the boundaries of the community to include soils, waters, plants, and animals, or collectively: the land . . . [A] land ethic changes the role of *Homo sapiens* from conqueror of the land community to plain member and citizen of it. It implies respect for his fellow-members, and also respect for the community as such."





Awards

- These may be deprecated, but...
 - They are available for all Cub Scout ranks and are still listed in Scoutbook.
 - Scouts can still earn the awards and can buy any existing patches, etc. that are in Scout stores
- And they are still important
 - Not all the information is covered in the individual rank adventures, and some miss nearly all of it.
 - Scouts spend a lot of time outdoors. It's critical for scouts of all ages to understand how to behave responsibly and respect nature, so best to start early.




Real World Example

Fun Fact: 100% complete rate for the den






Overlap with Advancements

Outdoor Ethics in Action requires

- Tiger: Tigers in the Wild
 - (was Let's Go Outdoors)
- Wolf: Call of the Wild
 - (was Your Living World
- Bear: none
 - (but was Family Outdoor Adventures)
- Webelos: Webelos Walkabout
- Arrow of Light: Outdoorsman



All of them involve **some portion** of learning Outdoor Ethics <u>but</u> leave out key elements.


