WFA Wilderness First Aid (TWO DAYS, Outdoors, Extra Cost)— (all day PLUS) The WFA charge shown in Tentaroo (registration) is in addition to the cost of PTC. WFA is a 16-hour hands-on training (two days - **Saturday AND Sunday, 9 am - 4:30 pm**) is designed to prepare you to systematically deal with any accident or first aid emergency when you and your group are more than one hour away from Emergency Medical Services. Youth must be at least 14 years old. Come prepared to spend most of the class outdoors in fall weather. Bring a day pack with the ten essentials and a blue foam pad. To complete the class and be certified you need current CPR certification.





Time Block ONE

101 Den Chief Training (for YOUTH and Den Leaders)—  (3 sessions) One of the positions of responsibility a Scout can hold is Den Chief. This course is for current and future den chiefs, and Den Leaders (with or without a den chief). They will learn their duties in the Cub Scout program while learning the leadership, organization, and problem-solving skills needed for success. Additionally, they'll learn some food ideas they can use to help Den Leaders and make their patrol meals more interesting. Finally, games are a great way to help Den Leaders. The youth will play some games they can use with their Dens as well as take back to your troop.


102 Den Leader (& assistant) Training— (4 sessions) Become Position Trained with this 4 session interactive training which covers the basics on the Cub Scout program, how to prepare for Den meetings and run a successful advancement program at the Den level. 


103 Whittling Chip (for ADULTS)— (1 session) To whittle or not to whittle, that is the question. This class will show parents and leaders how to handle a knife safely, Whittling Chip requirements, and basic skills in an in-person and virtual environment. Have your pocket knife handy. For adults only. 

104 Pack Committee Training— (4 sessions) Become Position Trained with this 4 session interactive training which will help your Pack thrive with a strong Pack Committee! Objectives include defining the role of the Pack committee, makeup and functions of the Pack committee, recruiting leadership and volunteers, record keeping, and the Pack planning process. 

105 Den Leadership and Program Planning— (1 session) Advance planning is the key to success in any venture, including Cub Scouting. We'll discuss scheduling, organizing, planning and budgeting activities; help your Scouts make progress toward rank advancement; and ensure everyone is having fun! We'll address working in concert with pack and committee leadership. Also, 


we'll discuss how to work as a Scouting team with parents and families, effectively sharing leadership to improve the quality of the den program.

106 Webelos to Scout Transition— (1 session) The last six to twelve months of Cub Scouting (Webelos).  This class is designed for Commissioners, Webelos leaders and parents, Cubmasters, and Scout Leaders. It focuses on transitional issues and ways to ensure a seamless transition between programs.

107 Scoutmaster (& assistant) Training— (6 sessions) This leader-specific training is for Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters, and interested parents. Learn how a 'Scout-led' troop operates. Have confidence managing the Scoutmaster role. Learn about the resources available to ensure success. (Scoutmasters and assistants will also need Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills to be trained.)

111 Making First Aid REAL— (1 session) Let's face it, First Aid merit badge training mostly focuses on simple skills like how to splint an arm or put on mole-skin. Come learn techniques you can use to take your Scouts to a new level by actually teaching them how to handle emergencies. Leave with an outline, scenario descriptions, and supporting materials you can use to plan and conduct a First Aid 'disaster training' that will become your Scouts' favorite event.   


112 Developing Scouts into Leaders - Unit Leader Methods— (1 session) Developing leaders is not just a programmatic experience for youth. Unit Leader leadership, vision and role modeling is key. Learn some practical perspectives on how to make you and your team's leadership model a blueprint for youth development and leadership for life skills.

This course reviews and reinforces the core concepts of unit service and identifies the key skills needed for commissioners to be able to assess the units they serve. (Bachelor of Commissioner Science 101)

410 Unit Advancement Chair Training—(1 session) Learn what it takes to be a good Advancement Chair for your unit, whether it be a pack, troop, crew, or ship. 


411 Explore the Patrol Method (for YOUTH)—(1 session) This class is what a Scout Needs to Know! Discuss and experience the Patrol Method for your Troop. Adults are welcome, but will be bumped for Scouts if needed. 


412 New! Mental Health Challenges for Troops and Crews (ADULTS Only)—(1 session) We are finding that mental health issues are cropping up consistently in Troops and Crews. Adult leaders, especially unit leaders seldom have the professional skill or specific training to recognize and deal with these youth and parents. This course will give you the highlights of the common mental health issues you will run across and suggested methods and resources to successfully intervene. 


413 Ultra Light Backpacking—(1 session) Discussion will include types of gear, places to find ultra-light gear, costs, and age appropriateness. 

414 Scoutbook—(1 session) Get help with getting the most out of Scoutbook, keeping up with changes, and get your questions about Scoutbook answered.

502 New! Creating a Safe Cub Environment—(1 session) Come and learn about how to ethically lead your Cub scouts. From practicing and teaching ethics, to helping facilitate friendships and involvement in the Pack, you will gain insight how to keep the fun in your safe and educational fundamentals! 

504 Recruiting and Retaining Cub Scout Leaders—Starting from Join Night—(1 session) Recruiting and retaining Cub Scout leaders is vital to improving the quality and diversity of the program and growing the pack. Yet recruiting new leaders and retaining good leaders from year to year can be a challenge. This course will offer useful recruiting ideas and techniques to finding potential leadership talent within your pack, and for approaching and cultivating prospective volunteers starting at join night. This course will discuss encouraging volunteerism of all families, retention of quality adult leadership, including the importance of communicating with, and recognizing and rewarding successful adult leaders and volunteers.

602 Den Discipline— (1 session) Reinforcement for Good Den Behavior, adjusting for active children. Decisions about meeting times, understanding medications, etc.

604 New! Summertime Planning for Packs— (1 session) Come learn how to keep your pack spirit and fun up through the summer. From different types of Cub Camps to the Summertime Pack Award, come share ways to beat the heat while keeping your Scouts engaged in the summer.
