WELCOME

Welcome to the Seattle Area 2023 Camporee! This year the Camporee celebrates the simple blue tarp. Come prepared to pitch a dining fly to keep your patrol dry in the rain.

Camporee is about your spirited participation in the scout-skills competition, exhibitions, adventure, and of course the fun. It is our intent to provide the atmosphere and opportunity for your unit to have a safe, fun, and educational time.

Camporee is primarily an activity to enhance the Patrol Method within your unit. It is also a chance for scouts to show off their skills at camp-making, cooking, teamwork, and cooperative methods of taking on tasks. All activities are run with the Patrol Method in mind. Camping is set in large troop areas, but each patrol will be judged on their ability to complete scout skills as a team.

Please read the entire Leader's Guide. The most successful units at Camporee will have thoroughly read and attained a complete understanding of all the sections covered in this Leader's Guide.

Saturday Activities

Patrols will split the day between Trails and Mountain Man activities. Half of the patrols will do the Trails competition in the morning while the other half do the Mountain Man activities. Patrols will switch activities in the afternoon.

The **Trails** portion is a part of the competition. Patrols are judged on skills, teamwork, and leadership.

The **Mountain Man** activities include archery, .22s, hatchet/knife throwing, and slingshots. These activities are not a part of the competition.

There is an **Iron Chef** cooking competition at lunch. Please see the Iron Chef scoresheet towards the end of the Leader's Guide. We need adults and older scouts to help with the activities. Signup sheets will be available at the registration table on Friday evening.

Camp Edward

We are pleased to hold this year's Camporee at Camp Edward. We are privileged to use the facilities provided by our host, but certain restrictions are imposed on us to protect the property. These expectations fit right into Leave No Trace principles.

A Scout is Obedient

Camporee is governed by three simple rules: the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, and the Outdoor Code. All activities and participants must comply with the <u>Guide to Safe Scouting</u>.

A Scout is Prepared

UNIT LEADER

Each unit leader is responsible for having in their possession: permission slips, medical releases, and medical histories of ALL PARTICIPANTS (youth and adult) from their unit.

EQUIPMENT

Each unit is required to provide all equipment required to participate in the Camporee. That includes tents, stoves, cooking and eating utensils, and materials for camp equipment/gadgets, water, etc.

- Scouts: All standard equipment for a weekend outing. Plan for rain, snow, heat, and cold.
- Patrols: Cooking gear, patrol first aid kit, patrol flag
- Troop: Troop flag, American flag, troop first aid kit, fire safety supplies
- Trails competition: 1 Stave per scout and the 10 essentials

UNIFORMS

The complete Scout Field Uniform (Class A) should be worn at the flag ceremony on Saturday morning. Activity Uniforms (Class B) can be worn at all other times. Members of the Order of the Arrow are encouraged to wear their sash.

MEDICAL FACILITIES

Each unit should have its own first aid kit. Each unit leader will be responsible for the first aid treatment of minor injuries, and for the safe transport of participants in the event of a medical emergency *while maintaining two-deep leadership with the Scout and the remainder of the*

troop on site. Having said this, a first-aid kit and a medic will be on site in the event of a medical emergency.

DRUGS AND ALCOHOL

Drugs and alcohol are not permitted on the premises at any time. The presence of illegal drugs or alcohol may necessitate a call to local law enforcement. Standard rules from the Guide to Safe Scouting apply with respect to prescription medications.

FIREARMS

• Personal firearms are prohibited at Camporee.

LOADING AND UNLOADING: PEOPLE, PARKING, AND EQUIPMENT

Scouts will be dropped off in the Camp Pigott parking lot for the hike in activity on Friday evening. Large items, such as coolers and stoves, can remain in vehicles. All vehicles need to be driven around to the Camp Edward parking lot and cannot take the road between camps.

Arrival/Parking is often challenging part of Camporee for the Staff, youth, and adults. Be prepared and be patient with all the volunteer staff. If you have any participants in your unit that have a special need or mobility issue, please bring it to the attention of the adult parking advisor/ Camporee Chairperson before coming.

The gate to the Camporee area will be locked between 11:00 pm - 6:30 am. Contact staff members if you have an emergency need to pass through the gate.

Load In

- Camp Edward has no road access to campsites.
- Youth and adults are required to carry their personal gear (in the confines of a pack) to and from their campsites. Vehicles will not be used to transport personal gear.
- Consider bringing a wheeled cart for your unit gear. There are some wheeled carts but it's limited.

• Upon conclusion of Camporee, the loading of vehicles to leave will be conducted in a like manner as unloading.

REGISTRATION

Registration is required for all units. Units will be assigned campsites and notified of location.

FEES

- The cost for each registered youth is \$30.
- The cost for each registered adult is \$15.

CHECK IN

- All units are required to check in upon arrival.
- Wrist bands will be handed out at registration. Anybody without a wrist band on will be counted as not completing a registration.
- All units will be required to provide the following information:
 - \circ an updated number of adults and youth if any changes were made.
 - o confirmation of late payment from the scout office.
- Each unit leader is responsible for, and will have in their possession, the proper permission slips and medical release forms for each youth participant attending.
- Evidence of two-deep leadership and use of the buddy system, which will be strictly enforced throughout Camporee.
- Once at your appointed site, you immediately need to send over a member of your group to confirm the total number signed-in on site. This check-in is necessary for safety/evacuation requirements.

CHECK OUT

- Please let the Registration Staff know of any intentions your unit has for EARLY DEPARTURE. Arrangements should be made as soon as possible after check in.
- Early check out is available for units requiring leaving Saturday evening. However, we encourage you to remain until after campfire ceremonies are completed or leave before campfire.
- Check out is closed during campfire.
- Check out on Sunday is only available after the closing flag ceremony.

Outdoor Code / Leave No Trace Do's and Don't's

- Camp Edwards has provided us with a great venue to hold our Camporee. We are very excited to be able to use this facility and would be pleased if we could use it again in the future.
- No digging for gateway construction or other structures.
- Recommended method of construction is lashings, tripods, etc.
- There may also be some very rocky areas where the games will be held plan for it!

The abuse of these facilities will not be permitted. Abuse will be defined as, but not limited to

- any misuse of resources
- any actions that cause the areas to become unsightly or unsanitary
- the continued running of water on the ground.
- washing of dishes in the restrooms or at water spigots
