

Families can register individually or the troop can register multiple scouts





TRAIL TO EAGLE

A Guide for Eagle Scout candidates

GUIDEPOST ONE -- Be Prepared!

"Be Prepared" is the Scout motto and great advice. Your journey will be smoother if you prepare adequately for it. Prepare a plan for success at the start of the trail.

Seek guildance. Ideally, at your Life Social rank Scoulimaster conference you took the opportunity to discuss a plan to limely complete the requirements of the Eagle Scout rank. You could seek an additional conference to discuss the steps along the path to complete your Trait to Eagle. If your thoop has a Life-to-Eagle coordinator, that Scouter, along with your Scoulimaster, is ideally the person to hold the conference; optimizing you should schedule a conference with your troop advancement coordination and Scoulimaster.

Know the requirements and forms that apply, Consult the current Eagle Scout rank requirements (clinical as of Jan 1, 2021). See Eagle Rank Requirements EAGLE Earls Requirements and the Guide To Advancement. Download the Eagle Scout anak application (available in Scoutobox and it is the preferred option). Eagle Scout Service Project Workhook, and the Chief Seattle Council Confidential Letter of Recommendation form (all are available on the Chief Seattle Council Advancement/Eagle Advancement webpage). Familiatize yourself self all of these forms and resources. You must read the entire Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook before you choose your project.

Be aware that most of the Eagle Scout rank requirements require that the work be done "while a Life Scout". Men't badges are the exception rively count for the Eagle Scout rank requirement even if earmed before becoming a Life Scout But, holding a position of responsibility in the roop as a Star Scout will only count for achieving the rank of Life Scout, or doing a major service project before being a Life Scout cannot be used to complete an Eagle Scout rank requirement.

Make progress along the trail with an eye on the calendar. The active participation, Scout spirit, ment badges, position of responsibility, service project and unit leader conference requirements all need to be completed before your eighteenth birthday. A number of the requirements have minimum times, for example, active participation, holding a position of responsibility, and certain required ment badges, so plan with this in minimum.

- Pushes scouts to be all that they can be










- Pack 225 Grew 19% over 2020 from 47 to 56 Cub Scouts!
